Introduction

This report details UW-Madison study abroad participation for the Academic Year 2006-07 and Summer 2007, as reported in the Institute of International Education's *Open Doors* 2006-7 institutional data report regarding international educational exchange (http://opendoors.iienetwork.org/). Tables and charts include all UW-Madison students receiving credit (including transfer) on study abroad programs, unless otherwise noted.

In this report, an "Administrative Unit" is the UW-Madison department, school, college, or other unit organizing the posting for coursework completed while abroad. Included in this report are the following administrative units: International Academic Programs (IAP), School of Business, College of Engineering, School of Medicine and Public Health (which includes students doing clinical rotations abroad), Law School, School of Education, School of Nursing, College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, International Institute (which includes Fulbright students), College of Letters and Science (which includes graduate programs administered by the Departments of History and French & Italian), Brittingham Viking Organization (which sponsors students in specific Scandinavian programs), and Office of Undergraduate Admissions (which handles transfer credit for non-UW programs).

Summary


The number of UW-Madison students earning credit for study abroad in 2006-07 increased 14.2% from the previous year to 1846 students. In *Open Doors* 2005-6, UW-Madison was ranked 17th among the leading research institutions by total number of study abroad students for the academic year 2005-06, following New York University (2,809), Michigan State University (2,558), University of Texas – Austin (2,244), Penn State University (2,168), University of Illinois - Urbana-Champaign (1,988), University of Minnesota -Twin Cities (1,981), University of California - Los Angeles (1,966), University of Florida (1,926), University of Georgia (1,916), Ohio State University (1,858), Florida State University (1,826), University of Pennsylvania (1,815), University of Washington (1,724), University of Virginia (1,712), University of Michigan - Ann Arbor (1,701), and Brigham Young University (1,637). A total of 223,534 US students studied abroad in 2005-06 according to the Institute of International Education's *Open Doors* 2005-06—a 8.5% increase from the previous year.

UW-Madison programs attracted a greater proportion of female (68.8%) to male (31.2%) participants compared with the UW-Madison campus proportion of 52.7% female to 47.3% male. However, the ratio was similar to data on all US study abroad participants according to the latest Institute of International Education (IIE) figures as reported in *Open Doors 2005-06* (65.5% female to 34.5% male).


UW-Madison students received credit for courses offered in over 60 countries on six continents. Consistent with national trends, Europe continues to be the most popular study abroad destination for UW-Madison students, accounting for 63.3% of all UW-Madison study abroad participants. In 2006-07 UW-Madison sent a greater proportion of total participants to Europe, Asia, Africa, and the Middle East than the national averages reported by the Institute of International Education for these regions in 2005-06.


The percentage of UW-Madison students on year-long programs (10%) continues to be greater than the proportion of students nationally on year-long programs (5.5%), according to *Open Doors 2005-06*. Unlike many of the top ranking institutions that have high numbers of study abroad participants due to large enrollments in short term programs, the UW sends most students abroad for one or two full terms during the academic year. Campus wide, 55.9% of students abroad participated for one full term in 2006-07, compared to the 2005-06 national average of 41.7%. In *Open Doors 2005-06*, UW-Madison was ranked 6th among research institutions in number of students on long-term (year) programs and 5th in number of students on mid-length (semester) programs.

Table 1. UW-Madison Degree-Seeking Students Studying Abroad by Academic Year






Table 3. Participation by Residency




The proportion of UW-Madison students from Wisconsin participating in Study Abroad programs was slightly lower in 2006-07 than the overall proportion of Wisconsin residents on the UW-Madison campus. The proportions of Minnesota and Non-Resident students studying abroad were slightly greater than the campus proportions.





A greater proportion of female students (68.8%) studied abroad in 2006-07 compared with the UW-Madison campus proportion of 52.7% female to 47.3% male (*Source: UW-Madison Data Digest*). The study abroad ratio, however, is similar to national data on study abroad participants according to the latest IIE figures, as reported in *Open Doors 2005-06* (65.5% female to 34.5% male).






The greatest proportion of study abroad participants in 2006-7 were juniors and seniors. The designation of a student's academic level their term abroad is based on credits accrued prior to that term, so many students classified as seniors may only be in their third year of study at the university.




