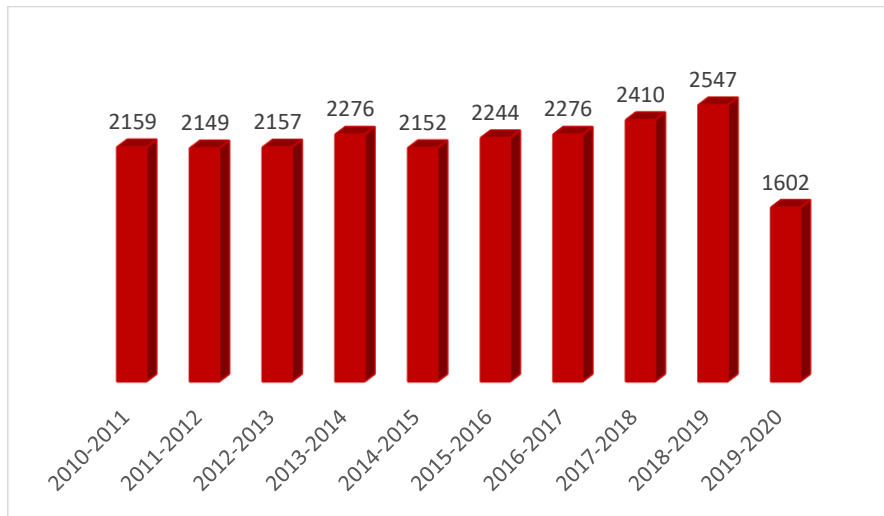
INTRODUCTION

This report details UW-Madison study abroad participation for the Academic Year 2019-20 (Fall '19 through Summer '20), as reported in the Institute of International Education's [Open Doors](#) institutional data report regarding international educational exchange. Tables and charts include U.S. students (citizens and permanent residents) enrolled for a degree at UW-Madison who received academic credit for their study abroad experience. Please note that this statistical year contains durations that were impacted by COVID-19 related travel restrictions. I. Participation by UW-Madison Degree Seeking Students* Studying Abroad by Academic Year: 10-year summary

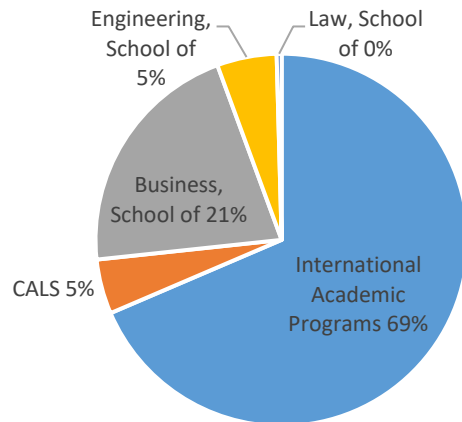

II. Participation by UW-Madison Students who Studied through a Study Abroad Administrative Unit

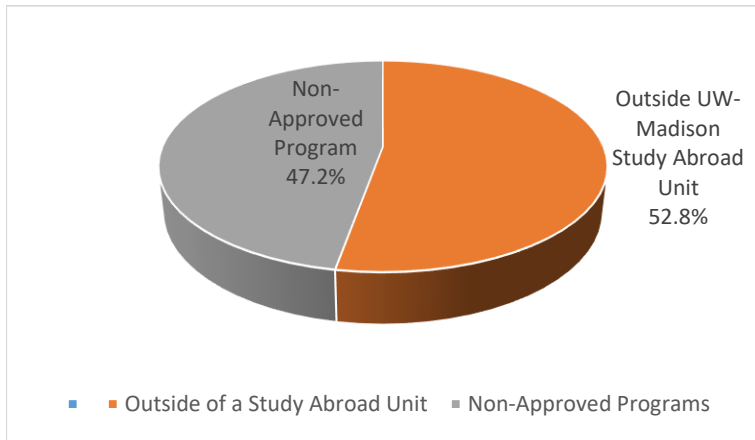

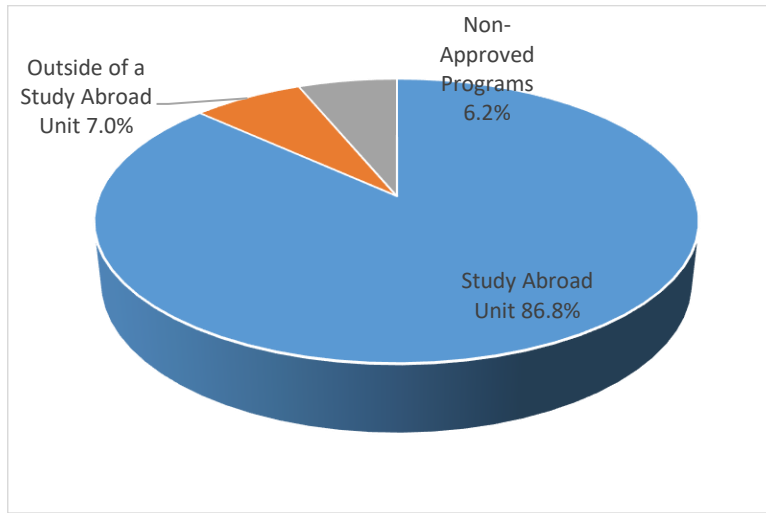
III. Participation by UW-Madison Students who Studied through a Non-Study Abroad Administrative Unit

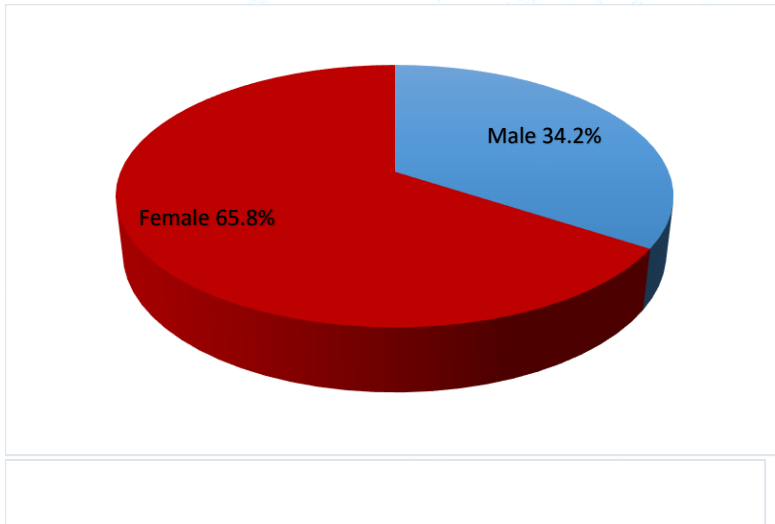

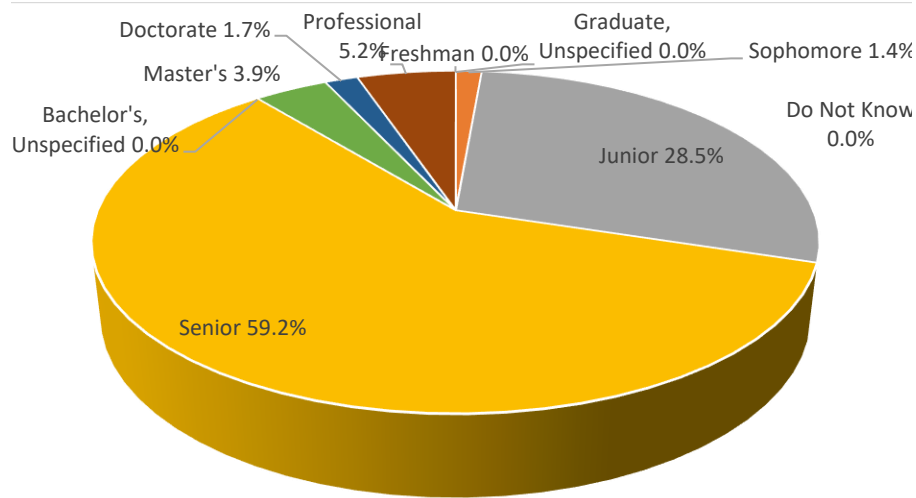

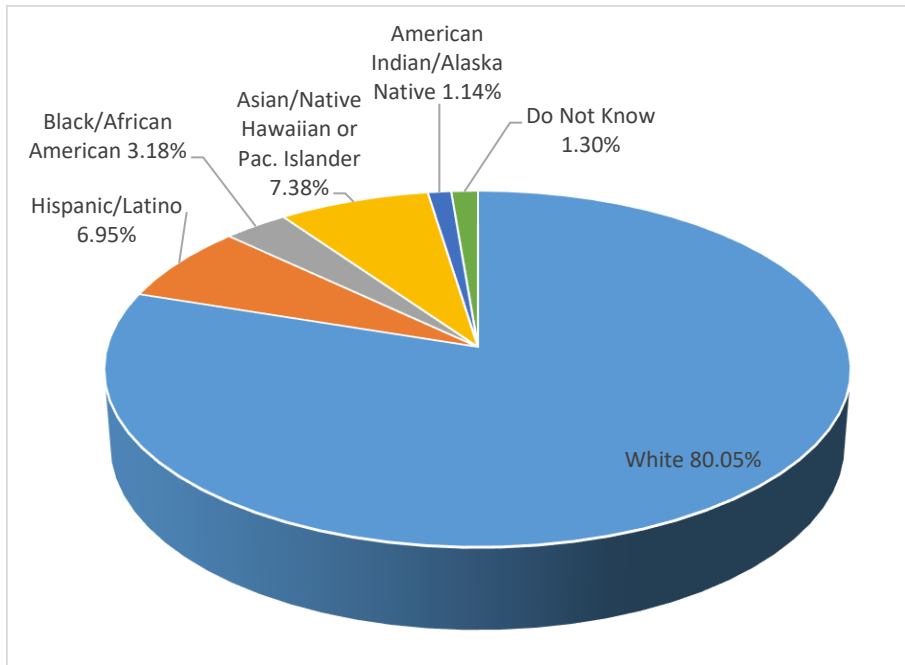

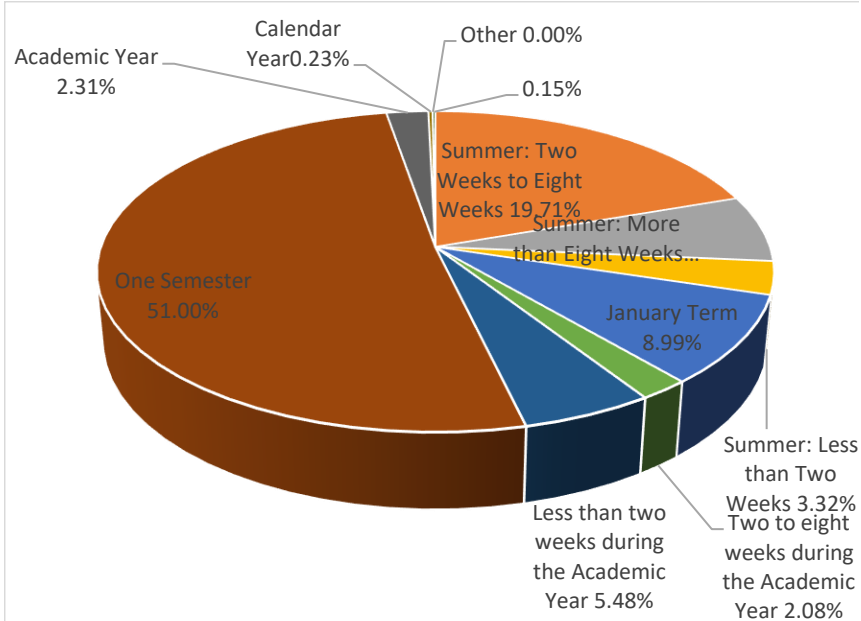

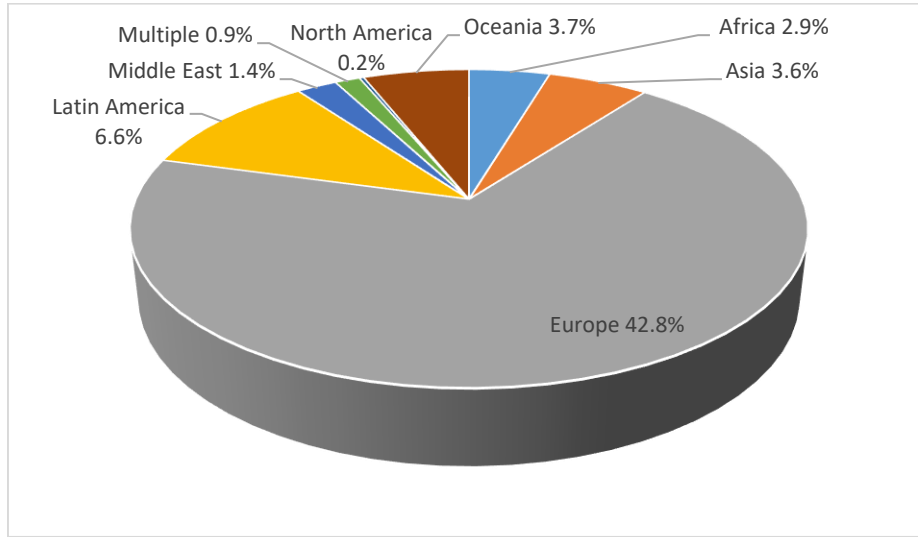
